#### <u>Class 1</u>

This week Class 1 have been writing their own Rainbow Fish stories. The children have also been writing prayers and hopes for our 'Wish Fish' display. In maths we have been learning how to share with bigger numbers. The children looked great on Thursday for World Book Day, we had a variety of story and superhero characters.



#### Class 2

This week class 2 have really enjoyed researching our 'under the sea' topic. We have begun to think about the animals that live under the sea and have learnt about the food chains that help them all to find the right nutrition. We have used the internet and information books to research our favourite sea creatures, ready to write a report on them next week. We have also made our own class glossary of all the new sea words we have been learning.



#### Class 4

This week Class 4 have been celebrating World Book Week and have also continued working in Literacy using the book The Ghost Of Thomas Kempe. In Maths we have been doing long multiplication and have started long division; and in Science we have been thinking about how light travels and reflects.

#### Class 3

This week, the children in Class 3 have been learning about Queen Boudicca and the rebellion she led against the invaders. They explored Roman episodes of her life through drama, then used these facts to plan and write a biography about Boudicca. In Science, the children learned about Roman catapults, and related these to forces. They also had great fun carrying out an investigation about fulcrums, to find out far a Cheerio cereal ring will travel if it is launched from various points along a lolly stick. In ICT, the children have been writing about the Roman army, and in Numeracy the focus this week has been written methods for addition and subtraction.
