## Class 1

This week in Class 1 we have launched our new topic, Around the World. Our role play area, 'The Airport' is well on the way to being set up and the children are very excited to work in there. We are learning about the town where we live and the local area; we have lots to think about!



## Class 2

This week Class 2 have been enjoying their new role play area, a travel agency to go with our topic of Around the World. They have recorded themselves in the shop on an iPad and their customer service, should you want to book a holiday with them, is very good! We have also been learning about Sikhism and had a special visitor to talk to us about the 5Ks.



## Class 3

This week in Class 3 we have started our new topic 'Changes' by exploring ideas for a picture called 'Another place, another time'. The children started by asking questions and writing observations about the picture, then they have delved deeper by suggesting events and feelings through drama outside. They have also drawn the setting which they imagine is the characters' destination and thought of effective language to describe it. More next week!
