Isaac for becoming more confident in answering questions on the carpet....it has been lovely to hear his ideas and answers.



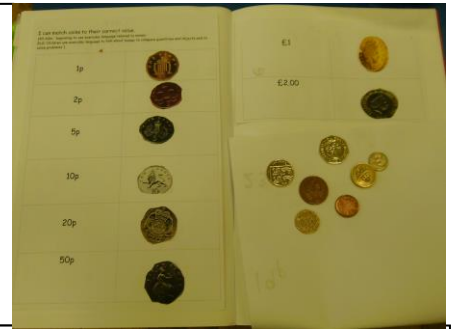
Mani - who has worked well in Numeracy - his work is neat and well-presented too!

Class 1

Class 1 have thought about our monetary systems; coin recognition and their values. Year 1 have been adding coins to find total amounts, up to and beyond £1. We have also been busy preparing for the outside learning area which will be an African marketplace.



Class 2

This week class 2 have continued to look at life in Australia. We have learnt about the art of the aboriginal people and experimented ourselves to create pictures to illustrate the Dreamtime story of Tiddalik. We have also read diaries of children who live in Australia and have written our own to explain what life is like in England.

Class 3

This week in Class 3 we have continued with our Changes theme by writing stories based on the picture Another Place, Another Time which we looked at last week. In Computing, the children have been working on posters about different types of changes, using font effects and text boxes. In Science, the children have sorted materials according to whether they are solids or liquids. Our Numeracy lessons have focused on mental and written methods for addition and subtraction. This week Class 4 have been using Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo as a way into the Islands topic. We have also painted islands and learnt about addition of fractions.
