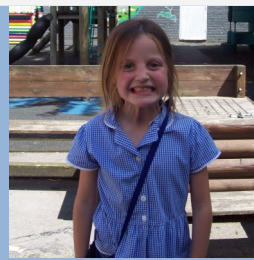
Class 1

Edward for being an excellent role model and guiding the Reception children in making good choices.



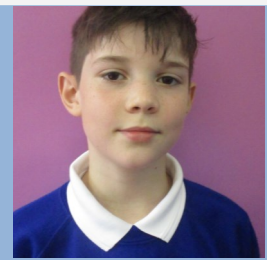
Class 2
