This week we have been learning...

Class 1 have reached Italy and we have been exploring Venice. The children have followed the adventures of a family touring on gondolas and visiting the fish market to buy squid. They have joined in with a variety of activities including writing their own adventure stories and postcards as well as making play dough pizzas and creating a range of Venetian masks. We have learnt about our senses in science. During maths some of us have continued to use our addition and subtraction skills to find the missing answers and others are securing adding numbers to 5 and 10. In RE we have thought about Jesus's love and how we can show our love.



Class 2 have been working on their skills of measuring in maths. They have been looking at the capacity of containers and reading scales to measure the amount of liquid. In Literacy, Class two have been using the Firebird Suite from Fantasia as an inspiration for their writing and artwork. In topic lessons, Class two have been looking at the difference between physical and human features of the earth.

Class 3 have continued to learn about the Chinese Mountains this week, researching them in great detail. They've also learnt about earthquakes, and practiced earthquake drills - which had some quite amusing results! In science, they're thinking about how sounds are made and how they travel to our ears. Very important if they need to hear an earthquake alarm! Some members of the class have also had fun building mazes on the playground for all the other children to enjoy at lunchtime with our great new equipment.



Class 4 In our work on Lent this week, Class 4 has been thinking about temptation. We have come to the end of our work on shape and geometry in maths whilst we have spent much of the week weighing up the pros and cons of Scottish independence in our debating and writing sessions. Now we have finished designing our own mythical beast, we can move on to writing and creating them...
